A word from executive director, Mo Basenberg

The accomplishments we saw in 2023 were centered around making the most of the stability and solid partnerships we have worked so hard to create in years past. With the move and co-location behind us, our focus was squarely on services to children and families, helping to ensure safety and healing for each child.



We know it is vitally important that our community knows we are here as a resource. Our goal to increase community awareness and education was met successfully, with 30+ media engagements and 40+ tours, including 11 political representatives. A highlight included hosting a mayoral forum that brought the importance of children and families to center stage. Additionally important was being featured by Rocky Mountain PBS and celebrating a new tool to help children who must testify in court.

We know 2024 will be a special year thanks to reaching our 30th Anniversary of serving those children who are most vulnerable. I approach 2024 with gratitude in my heart for the strength of the Safe Passage team and our partners who show up every day to make the world a safer place for our children.

A word from Board President, Geoff Heim

As seasons roll into years, I'm both surprised and unsurprised at the stability and growth of Safe Passage as we get ready to celebrate our 30th anniversary of providing Hope and Healing for sexually abused children. 2024 will be my 12th year on the Safe Passage Board of Directors. I was a Board Member from 2000 through 2005 and Board President from 2002 through 2005. I rejoined in 2019 and have been Board President since 2020. So why am I surprised?



Back in the early 2000s, we identified the need for a bigger facility than we had, and co-location was the paradigm we dreamed about. But we didn't have the horse power to get the larger facility and sell our vision to make our dream a reality. Heck, stability wasn't even a given. Many months there were times we crossed our fingers we'd be able to cover expenses. Why am I not surprised? Our mission. Our agency partners. Our employees. Our community champions (you!). But the main reason we closed out our Capital Campaign ahead of deadline? The real reason we have achieved the financial stability we could only dream about 24 years ago when I started? The real reason we are about to celebrate 30 years of Hope and Healing?

It's the **kids we serve**. They deserve the best we can give them. We strive to do just that everyday. So join us in celebrating how we got to this point, and join us in our efforts to refine how we help those children through their worst days - how to help them find their Power and their way to Hope and Healing. Listening and Believing

STORIES OF IMPACT



A 16 year old boy named Sam (changed for confidentiality) shared with his parents concerning abuse situations that had happened between him and an elderly neighbor. These situations had happened over a span of years and he courageously came forward to tell his parents. During a family discussion, the boy's brother-in-law also shared his own haunting experience with the same elderly neighbor years ago. The brother-in-law's case had been reported but remained unresolved due to the complexities surrounding the case.

Sam, empowered by his family's support and the shared experience with his brother-in-law, decided to report the abuse to law enforcement. At that time a forensic interview at Safe Passage was scheduled and conducted. The interview uncovered the layers of trauma and abuse. This act of bravery by Sam initiated a chain reaction of justice and healing.

The detective on the case, recognizing the gravity of these revelations, approached the brother-in-law, now an adult, offering a chance to share his story in a safe and supportive environment. This opportunity was a critical step in acknowledging and validating his long-held trauma.

The combined strength and honesty of the two survivors' testimonies led to a significant breakthrough in the investigation. After both interviews and additional inquiries, the perpetrator was apprehended and held accountable for both the recent abuse and the unresolved case from almost a decade ago.

This story is an example of the bravery of our clients and the power of giving children/teens the ability to be listened to and believed. Their stories, interwoven with pain and resilience, highlight the importance of supportive environments like Safe Passage that facilitate healing and justice.

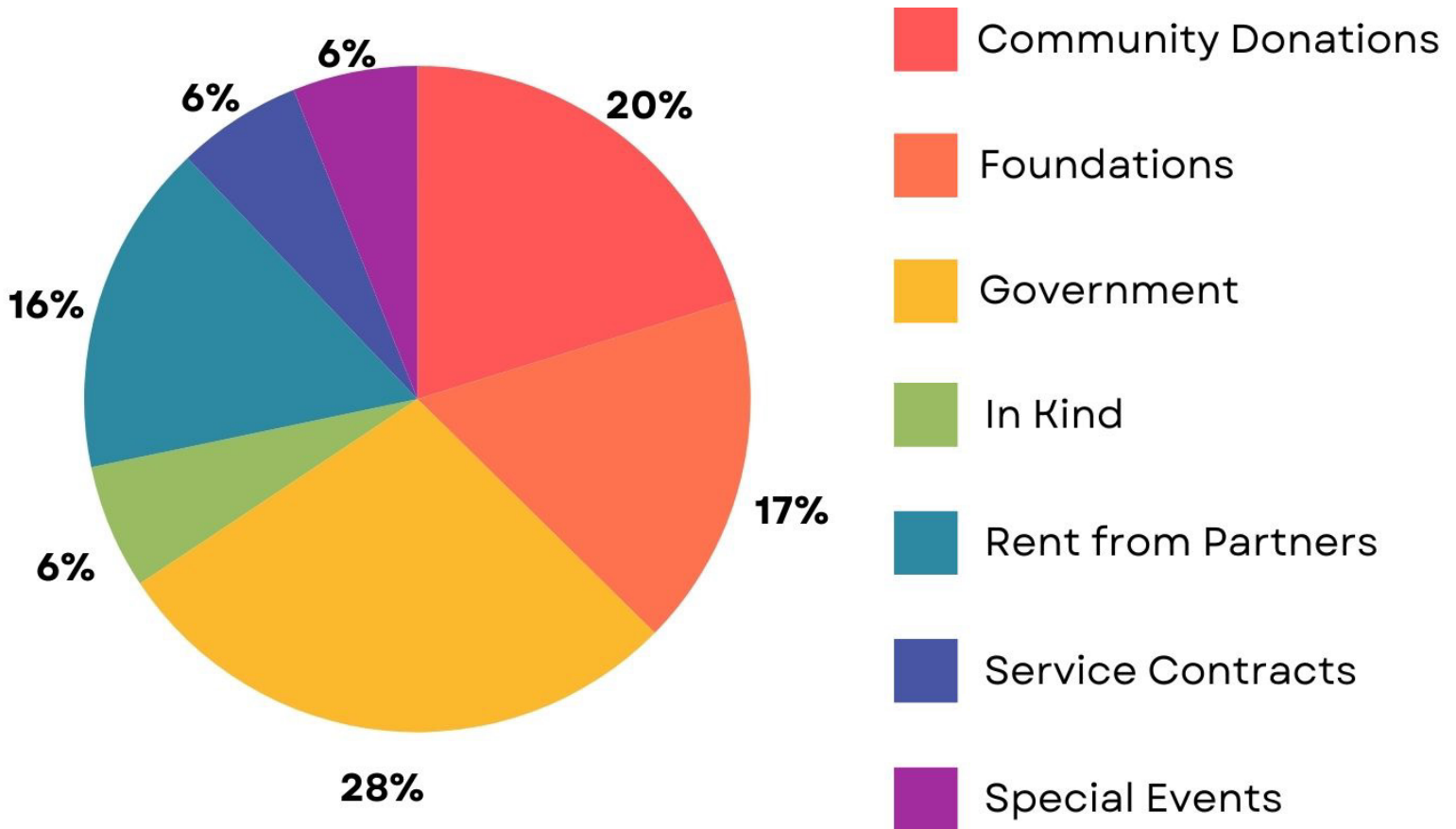
