



## Community Plays a Key Role In Preventing Abuse

In 2023, the Colorado Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline system received 117,760 calls related to concerns about a child's safety or well-being. El Paso County received the highest volume of calls of any other county in the state.

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, an important time to recognize the signs of abuse, and call the Colorado Child Abuse and Neglect Hotline (844-264-5437) if you are concerned about a child or youth.

We know 1 in 11 children will experience sexual abuse by the age of 18. As Coloradans, we can take a proactive approach in recognizing the signs of abuse like isolation, erratic behaviors, unexplained injuries, and trouble at school, by taking action to keep kids safe.

We can also promote protective factors in our community so that abuse and neglect never happen like parental resilience, social connection, support systems, parental and child development training, and social and emotional competence in children.

Every parent needs support from time to time. The <u>CO4Kids partner organization list</u> provides additional services parents and caregivers can utilize for extra support.
